Symposium on American Folk Painting

Presented by Barbara Ross Luck
Curator of Paintings, Drawings and Sculpture

Tour of the Jacques Dupre House in Jarreau

Featured on the cover of *Creole Houses*, the Jacques Dupre House was purchased by Sis Hollensworth in disrepair where it had stood for generations near Opelousas. The namesake and longtime resident of the raised cottage was Jacques Dupre, a former Governor of Louisiana from 1830-31. Ms. Hollensworth restored the house with great passion, doing much of the work herself including mixing the mud-based *bousillage* used to repair the upper walls. The house is primarily furnished with Louisiana-made pieces, some of which are featured in *Furnishing Louisiana: Creole and Acadian Furniture, 1735-1835*.
